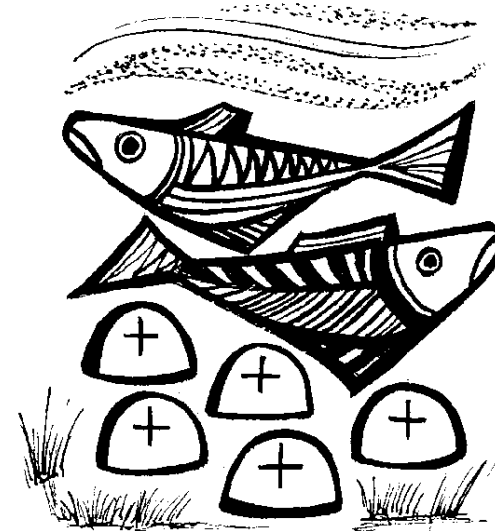

TODAY: 18TH SUNDAY YEAR A

Today we hear Jesus how Jesus feeds the 5000. A miracle with many levels of meaning to it. One of them comes from the line: “give them something to eat yourselves”. There are many times when we think we can do nothing to resolve a situation. Jesus asks the disciples to give the little they have and then because of their generosity and faith in Him, He is able to effect the miracle. At the Eucharist we are called to give what little we have with faith in Him and he can effect miracles in our lives.

Welcome to Hazel Margaret Parr who will be **baptised into the Body of Christ** today.

Public Masses:

The Church wants to ensure that the safety of people is paramount so we will proceed with small steps. Thus, the **Sunday Mass obligation is still dispensed**.

We have resumed having public Mass and all seems to have gone smoothly. Many thanks to the stewards who have helped so much in guiding and then remaining to clean all the pews and “touch areas” after each Mass. We could not open without this great service.

Please do not pass within 2 metres of anyone else outside your household: allow plenty of room to pass by each other. Do not gather or chat in the entrance and exit areas as these are narrow areas and people cannot pass.

St Mary’s Brownedge can accommodate approx. 80 individual people with 2 metre safe distancing (3 people per alternate pew). This number increases with every household or bubble being able to sit together. Please indicate to the stewards at the door how many you are and they will show you where to sit. If we do reach capacity a steward will take your name and number and we will call you so that you can reserve a seat at an upcoming Mass. If you are able to come to a weekday Mass that might spread the numbers. Please respect the guidance of our stewards. You

are asked **not to kneel down** as this may encroach within a safe distance to someone sitting 2 rows in front.

The hosts will be covered with a pall while on the altar to reduce risk of any droplets which the priest prays the consecration. The priest or minister will sanitise their hands immediately before and after distributing Holy Communion. Some churches are distributing Holy Communion at the very end and people are asked to make their way out immediately. We do not believe this is necessary in our church: you will be guided to Holy Communion section by section and receive only in the hand with arms outstretched; return to your place by a circular route. If you are not coming forward for Holy Communion or a blessing, you are asked to step into the aisle to allow those on your row to pass in or out easily

The Mass will be kept quite short; there will be no communal singing, any Mass sheets are single use only and you should take them away with you; There will be no offertory collection or procession of gifts; there will be a collection box at the entrance and exit; you are asked to put your offertory money in as you enter or leave, or you may continue the practice of putting it through the presbytery letterbox.

Face coverings: From 8th August face-coverings will be mandatory in church. People with respiratory issues, children under 11 years of age and some other people are exempt. Face-coverings can be removed by readers as they read the scriptures. The Priest and, if used, Eucharistic Ministers need only wear a face-covering when off the sanctuary and distributing Communion.

Summer Mass times: In the month of August we not have an 11am Mass on a Sunday. Other times will remain the same.

We will continue to have daily Mass at 9.30am each day during this time and Rosary at 8pm. Services will remain available online; we know that one of the blessings to arise out of this pandemic is that we can bring the church into our homes in a very special way: *we are the church*. We continue the practice of spiritual communion for those at home.

Opening for Private Prayer: Those who are uncomfortable about coming to Mass may prefer to call in for private prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. Holy Hour will be on Tuesday and Thursday from 5—6pm Thanks again to the stewards who have volunteered to be present to facilitate this.

Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals: these can now be celebrated in church but are subject to different rules enforced by the government with a limit of 30 people.

Confession: it is now possible for priests to hear confessions but it is recommended that this is done outdoors A priest will be available in the churchyard by the back door of the sacristy on Saturdays from 10-10.30am, if the weather permits, or by appointment with one of the priests.

Offerings: Thank you for your financial support of the parish, especially at this challenging time for so many people. Please try to post your offertory donations and any Mass intentions through the Letterbox of the Priory which is locked inside. Also, the diocese have set up an easy way of making online donations.
